

PRAYER OF ST. MICHAEL THE ARCHANGEL

Saint Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle. SEVEN SUNDAYS OF ST JOSEPH

The custom of dedicating the seven Sundays to St. Joseph before his Feast Day dates back to Pope Gregory XVI (pontificate: 1831-1846). Each Sunday is dedicated to one sorrow and one joy of St. Joseph as follows:

First sorrow: When his mother Mary had been betrothed to Joseph, before they came together she was found to be with child of the Holy Spirit (Mt 1:18).

First joy: An angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, "Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take Mary your wife, for that which is conceived in her is of the Holy Spirit; she will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus' (Mt 1:20-21).

Second sorrow: He came to his own home, and his own people received him not (Jn 1:11).

Second joy: They went with haste, and found Mary and Joseph, and the babe lying in a manger (Lk 2:16).

Third sorrow: At the end of eight days, when he was circumcised, he was called Jesus, the name given by the angel before he was conceived in the womb (Lk 2:21).

Third joy: She will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins (Mt 1:21).

Fourth sorrow: Simeon blessed them and said to Mary his mother, "Behold, this child is set for ... a sign that is spoken against ... that thoughts out of many hearts may be revealed" (Lk 2:34-35).

Fourth joy: For my eyes have seen thy salvation which thou hast prepared in the presence of all peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles (Lk 2:30-32).

Fifth sorrow: An angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, "Rise, take the child and his mother, and flee to Egypt, and remain there till I tell you; for Herod is about to search for the child, to destroy him" (Mt 2:13.

Fifth joy: And he remained there until the death of Herod. This was to fulfill what the Lord had spoken by the prophet, "Out of Egypt have I called my son" (Mt 2:15).

Sixth sorrow: And he rose and took the child and his mother, and went to the land of Israel. But when he heard that Archelaus reigned over Judea in place of his father Herod, he was afraid to go there (Mt 2:22).

Sixth joy: And he went and dwelt in a city called Nazareth, that what was spoken by the prophets might be fulfilled, "He shall be called a Nazarene" (Mt 2:23).

Seventh sorrow: They sought him among their kinsfolk and acquaintances; and when they did not find him, they returned to Jerusalem, seeking him (Lk 2:44-45).

Seventh joy: After three days they found him in the temple, sitting among the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions (Lk 2:46).





REGIS HIGH SCHOOL: REACH

Taking place on Saturdays and summers, REACH is a free educational and enrichment program exclusively for middle-school Catholic boys run by Regis High School in Manhattan. Since 2002, REACH has placed over 530 young men at partner Catholic high schools, and our Class of 2023 just earned over \$3.5 million in scholarships and financial aid commitments at outstanding schools like Regis, Fordham Prep, and Xavier.

What is happening to our humanity?

There is no shortage of reasons to ponder this question: daily images of gratuitous violence; an epidemic of suicide; feeling suffocated by the imposition of opposite ideologies and their language, starting in school; the potential threat of generative Al; a sense of paralysis in front of the future; suffering and evil devoid of meaning or redemption; general weariness, malaise, numbness, and lack of desire.

When something wakes us up, things come alive again. If we pay attention to our experience, these very same signs reveal that what makes us human is irreducible. We feel disappointed because to be born comes with a promise. We are afraid because we have something to lose. We feel suffocated because we are made to be free and to affirm what is true. And we feel lost because we are made for a purpose.


